A deeply devotional Vishnu Sahasranama Chanting was held at the future temple site. Following the Thantri's guidance, sacred offerings were made to Lord Ganesha, Guruvayurappan, Brahmarishi Mohanji, Yogeeshwara, Vastu Purusha, Vastu Devata, and Lord Brahma before the collective chanting commenced. The vibrations filled the temple grounds with profound peace and devotion.

A group of nearly 50 people came together to put their collective intention for the construction of the temple. Several devotees from around the world joined online as well. As a sacred blessing, every participant received sanctified paddy grains and sacred soil from the future sanctum — to be worshipped at home until the Prāṇa Pratiṣṭhā in February 2027, when they will be returned and woven into the final consecration.



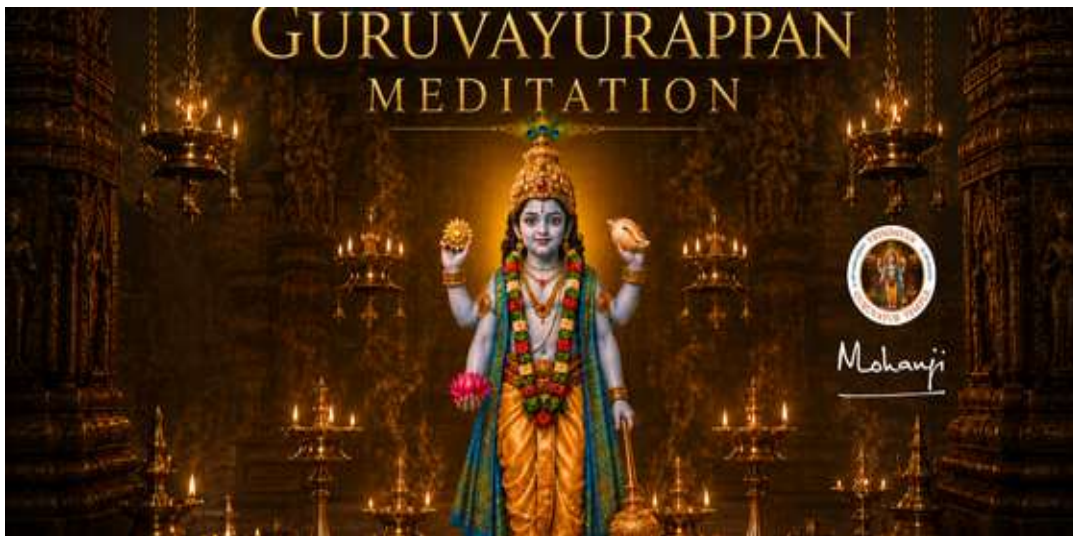
