What's Happening Now

- Stone work is actively progressing across shrine structures
- Dhwajam (flagstaff) wood has been identified
- Woodwork for key structures is commencing in phases
- Efforts underway to stabilize material supply and skilled labour availability

KEY REQUIREMENT

Approximately 250 tonnes of high quality black stone needed for uninterrupted construction progress.



— WORK AT HAND

Next Steps & Priorities

1. Finalization of Master Plan and obtaining local government approvals for construction on site
2. Dhwajam ritual (Daaru Parigraham) and preparation
3. Acceleration of stone procurement and construction
4. Completion of stone and woodwork across all shrines
5. Initiation of Valiyambalam construction work

Cost Considerations

1. Funding requirement for uninterrupted stone procurement
2. Increased logistics and storage costs
3. Sustained monthly funding needed to maintain steady progress
