A Year That Changed the Ground Forever

A year ago in Nandgaon, the Shadadhara — six sacred energy-points — were laid into the earth beneath what will become the Sreekovil, the innermost sanctum. From that moment this ground is consecrated: a living energetic field awaiting Guruvayurappan Himself.

These six layers form the invisible spine of the temple. The uppermost point marks precisely where the deity's feet will rest at **Prana Pratishtha on 19 February 2027**. That spot is truly sacred, and it was activated a year ago. The Circle Closes in Vrindavan.

THE CIRCLE CLOSES IN VRINDAVAN

Before time began, Brahma prayed into the void and Mahavishnu drew His own light into form: *"This is Me. Worship this."* That first form — Guruvayurappan — descended through Vasudeva and Devaki, worshipped by Krishna in Dwaraka. When Dwaraka fell beneath the sea, Guru and Vayu carried it to Kerala — to Guruvayur, Bhuloka Vaikuntha. Now, guided by Brahmarishi Mohanji, that same essence returns to Vrindavan, where Krishna's leelas unfolded. One year after the Shadadhara, the walls are rising. **The Lord is coming home.**

STONE & WOODWORK PROGRESSING IN KERALA

While the Shadadhara consecrates the ground in Vrindavan, the hands of Kerala's master craftsmen are already shaping what will adorn it. Hundreds of black granite elements — pillar bases, column caps, threshold blocks — are being carved by skilled *Shilpis* according to traditional Thachu Shashtra. In parallel, the sacred temple timber — dedicated in Vriksha Puja in April 2026 — is being cured and seasoned. Every stone and plank carries the intention of the Divine before it reaches Vrindavan.
